

Biscayne Boulevard (Biscayne Blvd.) is US-1 in Miami-Dade. In Broward County, US-1 is Federal Highway.

From South

- Take I-95 North to N.W. 135th Street, Opa-Locka Blvd. (Exit 10B)
- Take 135th Street East to Biscayne Blvd. (US-1)
- Turn left on Biscayne Blvd. to N.E. 151st Street
- Turn right at N.E. 151st Street and follow the signs to the Kovens Conference Center (approximately 1.5 miles)

From North (including Ft. Lauderdale International Airport)

- Take I-95 South to Ives Dairy Road (Exit 16)
- Take Ives Dairy Road East to Biscayne Blvd.
- Take Biscayne Blvd. South to N.E. 151st Street
- Turn left at N.E. 151st Street and follow the signs to the Kovens Conference Center (approximately 1.5 miles)

From Miami International Airport

- Follow signs to I-95 North or Ft. Lauderdale
- Follow directions "From South" listed above

From West (Palmetto Expressway, Turnpike, or Golden Glades Interchange)

- Follow Route 826 eastbound following signs "to Beaches" (this becomes N.E. 163rd Street)
- Turn right on Biscayne Blvd. (US-1)
- Take Biscayne Blvd. South to N.E. 151st Street
- Turn left at N.E. 151st Street and follow the signs to the Kovens Conference Center (approximately 1.5 miles)



Making the Most of Miami







Considered Florida's largest urban park, Oleta encompasses more than 1,000 acres of greenery set against Biscayne Bay, ideal for kayaking, biking, hiking, swimming and camping. Enjoy a moment of tranquility as you emerge into a quiet world of tangled, tidal mangroves inside this protected river estuary.



Explore Miami's art galleries, wander past the mind-blowing street art, spend an afternoon at The Bass or the Pérez Art Museum Miami (PAMM), or get a glimpse of local Art Deco architecture in South Beach's Art Deco District with one of the Miami Design Preservation League's walking tours. Check out attractions such as Zoo Miami, the Venetian Pool, Miami Seaquarium, the Phillip and Patricia Frost Museum of Science and many more.



Spanning nearly 173,000 acres, Biscayne National Park is the largest marine sanctuary in the U.S. National Parks system. From colorful living reefs to coastal mangrove habitat and coralcovered ships that met their fate on the Florida reef, the National Park is home to aquamarine waters and a wide variety of wildlife that are waiting for you to explore. Don't have time for snorkeling? No problem! Come and discover 110 species of birds along the Biscayne Birding Trail, boat the scenic Boca Chita Key and climb the island's landmark lighthouse, or see a maritime forest in Elliott Key.

Parking

For hotel-inclusive package, self-parking is complimentary. We also provide two-way transportation from the Courtyard to the conference center at the beginning and end of each day.

Nearby Airports

Miami International Airport

- Distance: 17.9 miles (28.8 km)
- Transportation options:
 - Taxi, private shuttle (Jayride), or Uber: takes
 approximately 20-30 minutes and costs \$30 \$70.
 - Train: Take free MIA mover train to Miami Airport Station, then take Tri-rail train to Hollywood Station, and rides a 9minute taxi trip (9.7 km) to the Courtyard. The trip takes approximately an hour and costs a total of \$21 - \$27. MIA mover leaves every 5 minutes and train leaves every hour.

Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport

- Distance: 9 miles (14.5 km)
- Transportation options:
 - Taxi, private shuttle (Jayride), or Uber: takes
 approximately 20-30 minutes and costs \$25 \$90.
 - Bus: Take line 01 bus towards Aventura Mall, then walk for 13 minutes to reach the Courtyard. The trip takes approximately an hour and costs \$2 - \$3. Buses leave every 30 minutes.




Dress Code

The suggested dress code for all activities in the program is smart/business casual. Especially for the Miami food tour on Wednesday, as we will be walking throughout areas well-known for sunshine, we highly recommend comfortable outfit such as comfortable shoes, short-sleeves button down, etc.

Miami is famous for sunny and warm days year-round, though it can be chilly in the evening during the winter months. From December through February, temperatures range from the low 70s F (21 C) to the lows 80s (26 C) during the day and drop to 60s F (15 C) and 50s F (10 C). We also recommend packing light clothes with a light jacket for layering to adjust to the change in temperature.

Though winter is the least rainy season in Miami, be prepared for possible showers.
